New Party Option at the Clubhouse

In response to Member suggestions, the Board has approved a new Clubhouse rental option for small parties. Effective as of 2022, the Clubhouse can be rented, up to four weeks in advance, for small afternoon parties of up to 50 folks for a maximum of four hours at a rate of \$250. All other rental terms are the same as for the full day \$500 rental (deposit, responsibilities, etc.) Parties will need to finish up by 5:00 PM to accommodate general community usage.

New Furniture at the Clubhouse

For those who have not dropped by the Clubhouse recently, in the spirit of making the Clubhouse more comfortable for smaller informal gatherings, three leather couches have been purchased. While we are happy for all Members to use the Clubhouse facility and especially enjoy sitting in the new couches, please use with care and respect. Do not let your kids bounce on the couches and/or eat sticky sweets and drinks on them. There are plenty of tables and chairs to use.

Clubhouse Director, Veronika, asks that in case of spills, immediately use a dry cloth to blot. It is important to blot instead of wiping because you want to get all the moisture out instead of spreading it. Never use soap or solvents on the couches. Watch out for scratches. Avoid using sharp objects near the furniture. Again, lets enjoy sitting, chatting and keeping nice for years to come. These couches will remain in the Clubhouse for private parties and cannot be moved out to the shed or elsewhere.



Cleaning up! Drawdown, Dumpsters, and Bulkheads

Take a walk along the Parkway and you will see plenty of activity and updates to the waterfront as Awosting neighbors take the opportunity offered by the current lake drawdown to fix docks and bulkheads without fighting the waves. Some folks have asked about dumpsters for debris being pulled out of the muck. Currently, the Board is not planning dumpsters specifically for the drawdown, but may possibly make arrangements in the Spring.

The Board does have a good deal of drawdown work going on at the boathouse involving lots of cement! Sean Rice is working on shoring up the north end of the

boathouse and reconfiguring the launch area.

And Ditches and Trails

As a follow up to our reminder last month about keeping clear the road gutters adjoining your property to keep water diverted away from roads where it can turn to slippery ice or work its way under the pavement and do serious damage, our many resident hikers ask that folks refrain from dumping on trails -- not fireplace ashes, not tree branches, not leaves, etc. We all have a stake in keeping Awosting in tiptop shape for everyone's enjoyment.

Road and Parkway Fees

You probably do not want to hear about the ash borer again, but the reality is that Awosting Association has only gotten about half way through the removal of infested trees even though so many have already been felled. With that and general inflationary costs that affect insurance, road and drainage cost, etc., we will be raising the base Road & Parkway fee by \$50 and continue the additional assessment for another year. The result will be a cost of \$550 per Awosting home for 2022.

For members, there will also be a \$25 increase in membership fees. Watch for emails from the Treasurer at Awosting.org in January.
