Residents joined Board members on Thursday, November 13 at the Clubhouse for the annual Road & Parkway meeting. The discussion covered current projects, upcoming needs, and community concerns.

Docks & Parkway

Sean Rice shared continued progress on Parkway clean-up to ensure it remains safe and enjoyable for everyone. A recent property survey identified sheds and other stored items on Awosting land that pose insurance and liability concerns, so the Association will be moving forward to address each of those situations.

Roads & Trees

Chris Weidmuller reported that a few more trees still need to be removed and confirmed that striping on the speed bumps is still planned. In addition, "No Parking" signs will be installed in designated areas.

Treasurer's Report

Treasurer Debbie Purdy confirmed that R&P funds remain healthy as we wrap up 2025 projects and begin planning for 2026.

Maintenance Reminders: Fall & Winter

Leaf Disposal

Please do not leave piles in the street or drag leaves into culverts, drainage ditches, walking trails, or the garage parking area. These spaces serve all residents, and improper dumping leads to flooding, fire hazards, and added maintenance costs.

Bag leaves and take them to the recycling center and bring branches and brush to Skytop for free disposal. Proper disposal helps keep fees down and prevents costly repairs.

Winter Parking Rules

Large vehicles, trailers, and boats must be moved off the roads so plows and emergency vehicles can pass safely. Commercial vehicles may not be left parked overnight on Awosting streets at any time.

Per town ordinances, please be aware:

"Whenever snow has fallen and the accumulation is such that it covers the street or highway, an emergency shall exist, and no vehicle shall be parked on any Township public/private or county roadway in their entirety."
